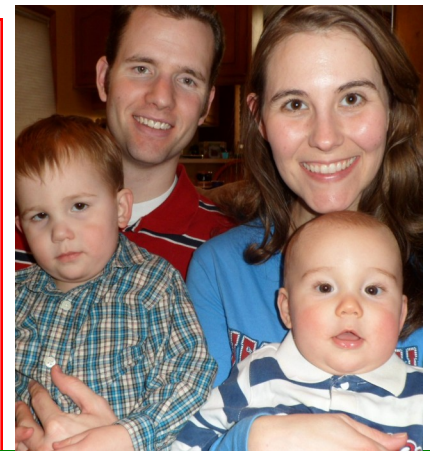
Damon and Judy Roach: Damon's brother from Kearney came and our first grand-daughter, Westyn, made her debut.
